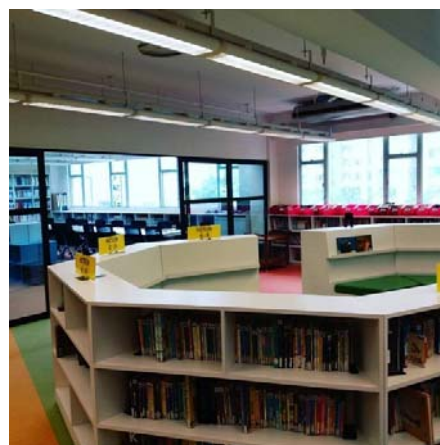


Library Open House for Parents on 13th October, 2017

Cambridge English: Young Learners is a series of fun and engaging activity-based English language tests. They introduce primary and lower-secondary level students to everyday written and spoken English, and are an excellent way to gain confidence and improve their English.

The tests are created for children and use topics they are familiar with. All of our exams cover the four language skills: Reading, Writing, Speaking and Listening. Students are encouraged to move through the three levels: Starters, Movers and Flyers.

With *Cambridge English: Young Learners*, teachers can motivate their students to learn English, and parents can see the progress and achievements made.

5. HKYWA

The HKYWA, is a writing competition for school's whose main aim is to foster excellence in creativity by providing students with the opportunity to develop their expressive talents and expand their horizons.

The awards encourage excellence in English writing and artwork among students of various age groups, diverse backgrounds and different learning abilities. Since its inception in 2010, the competition has been a resounding success, with more than 980+ innovative entries coming in from 200+ participating schools across Hong Kong, Macau and China in 2017.

All entries should be based on the theme for 2017, **New Journeys to the West**. Winners will be chosen in each of the groups, and one lucky student will be named The Hong Kong Young Writer of 2018.
